060-21/22: 1. Apologies – None

061-21/22: 2 Declaration of Interest – (Members are bound by the provision of the Code of Conduct adopted by Ludgershall Town Council and are required to declare their interest in any matter in which they have a personal interest or a pecuniary interest) None declared.

062-21/22: 3. Minutes of previous meeting held 15/02/2022 – Having considered the minutes, Cllrs Resolved to accept the minutes of 15<sup>th</sup> February 2022 as read, which the chair then signed as a true and accurate record.

- a) Update on plumber, options available to increase water - Cllr C Giles waiting to meet Wessex water to extend the water down to the allotments to increase water pressure. Council to look at increasing the number of troughs once the water has been extended.
- b) Pest control retainer update – Office to obtain a new pest control company.
- c) Plot markers discuss going forward – New plot markers proved too expensive, Cllrs to investigate wooden stakes to replace the missing numbers. Allotment holders need to be told that the markers need to be always visible and inside the plots. Suggestions made of making the numbers aluminous.

i) Bell Street – a) Inspection Report – Three plots have received initial warning letters,

b) To receive update on new allotments rented and waiting list 10 people on the waiting, 1 plot relet, evictions 0.

ii) Dewey’s Lane – a) Inspection Report – no bad allotments b) To receive update on new allotments rented and waiting list - 6 Dewey’s Lane given up, none relet, waiting list is 10. c) Plot 34 discuss – The fence looks to have been cut, Cllrs to go down and take a picture. Look into plot being given to a mental health charity, raised beds will need putting in.

064-21/22: 5. Jubilee Garden – New Cast Iron bin – Council agreed to order 3 bins, office to action.

065-21/22: 6. Cemetery – a) Garden of Remembrance fence – The quotes keep being amended by contractors and have proved costly. Council had a discussion over using rose bushes as a perimeter. Office to speak with Gavin Jones for idea of the volume of rosebushes needed.
