054-21/22 1. Apologies – all present no apologies.

Dewey's Lane -

a) Quarterly Inspection, Cllr J White presented the report, confirming work that has been completed and work that is scheduled to be done. There were 2 new items, algae on trim trail & outdoor gym due to the weather and the surface under the Animal Play Panel.

b) Roundabout cost of repair versus new item – Option 1 refurbish and replace wetpour £3,796.00 ex vat, Option 2 remove and dispose of old unit and supply and install new unit and replace wetpour £10,622.00 ex vat. The committee discussed and asked the Clerk to find out more information.

Pretoria Road -

- a) Quarterly Inspection not discussed but in agenda pack, one item to monitor surface under swing set. The major item is the fencing and gate which is in point b).
- b) Update on play area fence and access 3 quotes were requested from contractors who previously quoted one did not want to quote and one missed the deadline. The quote received for making the entrance accessible with a new ramped tarmac footpath and drop kerb access and to put a new bowtop fence around the playground is £16,264.00. Funding will come from the earmarked account for play equipment. The committee discussed, the work is required for accessibility and health and safety reasons and as the price of materials are increasing quickly it was felt that LTC should accept this quote asap. The committee would like to write to the neighbours to notify them of the work and to keep the work between the hours of 9am-4pm, to minimize traffic problems, clerk to confirm with contractor. Clir O White proposed LTC accept the quote and Clir M Williams seconded, all in favour. Action TC.
